CALL FOR PROPOSALS!

Description of the International Lecture Series (October 19-20, 2023)

The seventh edition of the International Lecture Series will be in hybrid format produced from St. George’s, Grenada via Zoom. The conference offers sexuality researchers, practitioners, educators, and activists an opportunity to share their work in a setting that will invite them to discuss the implications of how their professional endeavors impact selected communities. In other words, we will continue to explore the convergence of race and sexuality (e.g., Black Sexuality) through displaying *the courage to share the untold story*. Our creativity, imagination, emancipation, resilience, strength, and need for self-care (e.g., relaxation, peace, tranquility), will reveal itself during our presentations that center the invitation and opportunity to discuss the relational and sexual narratives of persons of African descent. Each story (presentation) will capture some of the systemic and experiential nuances of our communities. Since the host hotel in Grenada has WI-FI, we will meet online for our conference with in-person fellowship immediately following presentations for those in attendance.

Through our research, clinical best practice, pedagogy, and activism, we will share our work on reproductive justice, intimacy, interpretations of pleasure, relational decision making, and the management and negotiation of Black relationships and sexuality. We seek proposals that reflect the timeless beauty of Black sexual and relational expression; solutions to the challenges of intersectionality; Black aesthetics including body positivity and colorism; expansion upon issues that affect Black LGBTQAI including recent negative legislative and political sentiments; gender and reproductive politics; fantasy/desire and kink; media influences; polyamory, consensual nonmonogamy and other relationship constellations; sexuality education; sexual function/dysfunction; mental health practice; sociocultural factors; and the confluence of race, gender, and sexuality. Proposal submissions should reflect the theme of the conference.

Traditional Scholarly Presentation

Presentations will be 50 minutes in length. While Powerpoint slides are encouraged, presenters are encouraged to share no more than ten slides and facilitate a discussion for participants.

Dialogue Panel Presentation

The 50-minute dialogue panel presentations will be comprised of three or four panelists, who will each present a 10-minute brief about their idea or concept related to the theme. These briefs will be

followed by a facilitated dialogue between panelists and the audience to further explore the connections between the ideas presented in the briefs or explore possible outcomes. The goal of the panel presentations is to create a respectful, engaging environment to assess complementary and divergent perspectives.
